Pre-Registration

1. Students must pre-register at the registration desk, minimum one (1) hour before the championship starts.
2. Registration Desk is located in front of the sports court .
3. The Team Leader/Captain will be in charge of checking his/her team members' attendance.
4. Once all team members are present at the venue, the Team Leader must gather all team members and check the attendance list.
5. Students must be ready in their uniforms.
6. Bags and other personal belongings must be kept by parents/guardians.
7. After competing, all teams will stay in the sports court until the Winner Announcement starts.
8. Team Members are recommended to stay in their team group at all times.

Rules & Regulations

1. Game time : 2 × 10 minutes (U5)
2 X 12 minutes (U7)
2 × 12 minutes (U9)
2 × 15 minutes (U11)
2 × 15 minutes (U13) & (U14+)
2. 2 minutes break between each quarter and 5 minutes break half time.
3. Overtime: There will be no overtime. The team will get 3 points for the winner, then get 1 point if a draw, and 0 points if they lose.
4. Students are required to use Jersey, Futsal shoes, long socks, shin guard.
5. Before game: teams will have 5-10 minutes of warming up and briefing regarding game rules with coach.
6. Rules that applied for each age category based on FIFA rules and regulation

Code of Conduct

- 1. Fighting Policy:** Any player who attempts to strike an opponent using their arms, hands, legs, feet, or any other combative action will be immediately suspended from the game. The duration of the suspension will be determined by the Committee on a case-by-case basis.
- 2. Spectator Conduct:** Any spectators or visitors involved in a physical altercation during a game will be suspended from the facility. The length of this suspension will be determined by the Committee.
- 3. Player Eligibility Protests:** Only the coach of the opposing team in the scheduled game is allowed to protest a player's eligibility. All eligibility protests must be brought to the score table before the start of the game. Coaches must present documentation or proof of age upon request. If proper proof cannot be provided, the player(s) in question will not be allowed to participate until proof is submitted.
- 4. Handling of Protests During the Game:** The game will not be paused to address eligibility protests. If a protested player arrives late, the opposing coach may protest at halftime only. If the player(s) cannot provide proper proof of age at that time, they must sit out until proof is provided. Additionally, the team will be charged with a technical foul, resulting in the opposing team receiving two free throws and possession of the ball.
- 5. Parental Conduct:** Parents are strictly prohibited from loudly complaining to match officials, referees, or Committee members. Any concerns must be addressed through proper channels.
- 6. Committee Authority:** The Committee reserves the right to alter rules, bylaws, and bracket structures as necessary to ensure the smooth operation of the tournament.
- 7. Addressing Concerns:** Parents must email any concerns to studentcare.id@rockstaracademy.com on the same day the issue occurs.
- 8. Conduct and Sportsmanship:** All participants, coaches, and spectators must help ensure the game runs smoothly and are expected to refrain from using profanity, verbal abuse, racist remarks, negative cheering, or rude language towards other players, coaches, spectators, referees, and tournament staff.

9. **Responsibility of Coaches:** Team coaches are responsible for the conduct of their players. Both teams and spectators must adhere to all tournament rules and regulations.
10. **Food and Beverages:** No food or beverages are allowed on the sports court. Only water and sports drinks are permitted.
11. **Personal Belongings:** The Committee is not responsible for any personal items that are left behind, lost, or stolen.

Judges & Referees

1. Judges and Referees for Futsal Elite Championships are from PSSI (Persatuan Sepak Bola Seluruh Indonesia)
2. Scores are final. There will be one (1) winning Elite Team for Age Category and Division.
3. Winning Team will receive a trophy and all Elite team members of the winning team will receive Ribbons and a Certificate (delivered to respective academy one (1) month after the event).

Standings

1. The team will get 3 points for the winner, then get 1 point if a draw and 0 points if they lose.
2. Points will be updated on the standing on RockStar Academy website. Each age group has its own ranking.
3. Total points will be accumulated at the end of the league year and team with the highest point wins the year-round Championships.

Winners

1. 1st - Medal per Individual & Trophy for Team.

Emergency Procedures

The following procedures shall be implemented whenever a student is injured in the course of activities conducted at Elite Championships.

1. The instructor shall immediately notify the health personnel present at the activity and the health personnel shall assume responsibility for the emergency treatment of the student.
2. If no health personnel are present, or if none can be immediately summoned to the student's aid, the instructor shall administer such first aid as may be necessary.
3. If the student's injury requires more than routine first aid, the instructor shall:
 - Summon an emergency personnel.
 - Arrange for the student's transportation to the nearest hospital.
4. The instructor or his/her designee shall promptly notify the Event Manager, the Program Coordinator, and the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of the student's injury and the condition and location of the student.
5. An injured student who has been transported away from the premises must be accompanied by the instructor, a member of the Event Organizer, and the parents/guardians.

Readmission to Competition Activities

A student injured in the course of a competition activity will be permitted to participate in the competition only on the written permission of the medical inspector or designated team doctor, designated school health personnel who must first examine the student to determine his/her fitness to participate in competitions. Written notice of that determination, signed by the medical inspector or designated team doctor as appropriate, shall be given to the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s).
