Pre-Registration

1. Students must pre-register at the registration desk, minimum one (1) hour before the championship starts.
2. Registration Desk is located in front of the sports court .
3. The Team Leader/Captain will be in charge of checking his/her team members' attendance.
4. Once all team members are present at the venue, the Team Leader must gather all team members and check the attendance list.
5. Students must be ready in their uniforms.
6. Bags and other personal belongings must be kept by parents/guardians.
7. After competing, all teams will stay in the sports court until the Winner Announcement starts.
8. Team Members are recommended to stay in their team group at all times.

Judges & Referees

1. Referees for Basketball Elite Championships are from Perbasi.
2. Scores are final. There will be one (1) winning Elite Team for Age Category and Division.
3. Winning Team will receive a trophy and all Elite team members of the winning team will receive Ribbons and a Certificate (delivered to respective academy one (1) month after the event).

Procedures

1. Game time : 4 × 10 minutes.
2. 2 minutes break between each quarter and 5 minutes break half time.
3. Overtime: There will be no overtime. If the scores are tied, decision will be made by free-throw.
4. Time Outs: Each team will be given 1 time out (1 minute) per quarter, and cannot be accumulated.
5. Balls sizes:
 - U7 Mix, U9 Mix, U9 Girls, U11 Mix, U11 Girls = size 5
 - U13, U13 Girls = size 6
 - U16 Boys = size 7
6. Grace Period: A two minutes grace period will be allowed for tardiness and then if a team does not have four players to start the game, the game will start. Eight minutes will be allowed for a team to present four players to start. The team ready and waiting will begin amassing two points per minute up to eight minutes. If at this point a team does not have four players to start, a forfeit will be declared.
7. Team Fouls: Players will be given 5 fouls per game. Bonus shots will be given after the 4th team foul. There is no foul out for U7.
8. Technical Fouls: All technical fouls will count as a personal foul. If a player receives a second technical foul during the same game, the player will be rejected from the tournament.
9. Rules that applied for each age category based on FIBA rules and regulation (except there will be no 24 seconds).

Winners

1. 1st - Medal per Individual & Trophy for Team.
2. 1st - Certificates
(will be delivered to the Academy's 1 month after the winners are identified)

Code of Conduct

1. All participants, coaches and spectators are expected to keep the game running smoothly and shall refrain from using profanity, verbal abuse, throwing racist, negative cheering, or rude words towards other players, coaches, spectators, referees and the tournament staff.
2. Team coaches will be responsible for the conduct of their players. Teams and spectators shall abide by the tournament rules and regulations.
3. No food or beverages are allowed in the sports court. Only water and sport drinks will be permitted.
4. The committee members are not responsible for any personal items that are left behind, lost or stolen.
5. Fighting is an attempt to strike an opponent with the arms, hands, legs, feet or a combative action by one or more players will be immediately suspended from the game for the duration to be determined by the Committee Members. Length of suspension will be assessed on an individual basis.
6. Any spectators and visitors who will be involved in a fight during a game, will be suspended from the facility for a length of time to be determined by the Committee.
7. Only the opposing team's coach who is playing the scheduled game can protest a player's eligibility. Player eligibility protest must be taken to the score table before the start of the game. Documentation/proof must be presented upon request. If the coach cannot provide proper proof of age for their player(s) being protested, then player(s) will not be allowed to participate until proof is provided.
8. The game will not be stopped to handle the protest. If the player(s) show up late and the opposing teams coach wants to protest the player(s). That protest will take place at half time only. If the player(s) being protested at half time cannot provide proper proof of age then the player(s) must sit until proof can be provided and that team will be charged with a technical foul. As a result, the opposing team will get two free throws and the ball.
9. Parents are prohibited from complaining loudly to the match officials, referees and committee. Parents are not permitted on the team bench during matches. Coaches, referees, and committee members are authorized to issue warnings and, if necessary, ask parents to leave the venue if they fail to adhere to this rule.

Code of Conduct

10. Team and Personal Fouls (U10 and Above):
 - Teams will be subject to team fouls and personal fouls.
 - After 5 team fouls, the opposing team will be awarded free throws.
 - A player with 5 personal fouls will be required to sit on the bench for the remainder of the match.
11. Free Throw Rules:
 - U7 Mix, U9 Mix, U9 Girls, U11 Mix, U11 Girls: Players are allowed to step on the free throw line when taking a free throw.
 - U13, U13 Girls, U16: Players must not step on or over the free throw line during their attempt.

*Behavior Policy: *Any individual engaging in violent behavior, including fighting or disruptive actions, will be immediately expelled from the arena.
12. The Committee has the right to alter rules, bylaws and bracket structure as needed.
13. For any concerns, parents must email studentcare.id@rockstaracademy.com on the same day the issue occurs.

Procedures

1. Team will earn 2 (two) points for every match they win; 1 (one) for every match they lose; 0 (zero) for walk out.
2. Points will be updated on the standing on RockStar Academy website. Each age group has its own ranking.
3. Total points will be accumulated at the end of the league year and team with the highest point wins the year-round Championships.

Emergency Procedures

The following procedures shall be implemented whenever a student is injured in the course of activities conducted at Elite Championships.

1. The instructor shall immediately notify the health personnel present at the activity and the health personnel shall assume responsibility for the emergency treatment of the student.
2. If no health personnel are present, or if none can be immediately summoned to the student's aid, the instructor shall administer such first aid as may be necessary.
3. If the student's injury requires more than routine first aid, the instructor shall:
 - Summon an emergency personnel.
 - Arrange for the student's transportation to the nearest hospital.
4. The instructor or his/her designee shall promptly notify the Event Manager, the Program Coordinator, and the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of the student's injury and the condition and location of the student.
5. An injured student who has been transported away from the premises must be accompanied by the instructor, a member of the Event Organizer, and the parents/guardians.

Readmission to Competition Activities

A student injured in the course of a competition activity will be permitted to participate in the competition only on the written permission of the medical inspector or designated team doctor, designated school health personnel who must first examine the student to determine his/her fitness to participate in competitions. Written notice of that determination, signed by the medical inspector or designated team doctor as appropriate, shall be given to the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s).
