COMPETITION REGULATIONS

SPEED COMPETITION

1. The competition will be a speed race.
2. The route will include obstacles and feature 3 checkpoints.
3. The fastest participant to complete the route will be declared the winner.
4. Each participant will be given a 30-second free trial to familiarize themselves with the route.
5. Each participant will have 2 attempts, with a 1-minute rest period between attempts.

FREESTYLE COMPETITION

1. The competition will be a freestyle parkour event.
2. Participants will demonstrate free movements and paths through obstacles.
3. Participants in the 7-9 and 10-12 age categories must showcase 4 principal movements, while those in the 13+ age category must demonstrate 5 principal movements. Extra points will be awarded for perfect execution of these movements.
4. Each participant will have 30 seconds per round.
5. The competition will be assessed by 3 judges. Assessment categories include flow, creativity, execution, and mandatory skills.

PROCEDURES

1. Participants must register at the Front Office.
2. On the day of the event, participants must pre-register at the registration area, minimum one (1) hour before the competition starts and receive a cloth sticker.
3. Participants must check and confirm the competition schedule.
4. Participants are required to wait at the designated area and wait to be called by the committee.
5. Disqualification will be given to participants who are:
 - Late and are not able to present themselves after being called three (3) times
 - Not following the proper age category.
 - Inappropriate / bully behaviors: physical, emotional, taunting, calling names, talking about one another, etc. If you are a victim of this behavior, you must come to a teacher or Manager immediately so we can address this issue. Do not wait!

STUDENTS PERFORM

SPEED COMPETITION

participants will navigate various obstacles and must perform mandatory movements at each checkpoint. Each participant is given 30 seconds to try, two attempts, and a one-minute break between each attempt.

FREESTYLE COMPETITION

participants will perform free movements while running through obstacle courses while still demonstrating their ability to perform several mandatory core parkour movements. Participants will receive additional points for successfully performing the mandatory movements.

JUDGEMENT CRITERIA

SPEED COMPETITION


The participant who completes the obstacle the fastest will be declared the winner.

Participants will be judged directly by three main judges. Judging categories include flow, creativity, execution, and mandatory moves.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

The following procedures shall be implemented whenever a student is injured in the course of activities conducted at Elite Championships.

1. The instructor shall immediately notify the health personnel present at the activity and the health personnel shall assume responsibility for the emergency treatment of the student.
2. If no health personnel are present, or if none can be immediately summoned to the student's aid, the instructor shall administer such first aid as may be necessary.
3. If the student's injury requires more than routine first aid, the instructor shall:
 - Summon an emergency personnel
 - Arrange for the student's transportation to the nearest hospital
4. The instructor or his/her designee shall promptly notify the Event Manager, the Program Coordinator, and the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of the student's injury and the condition and location of the student.
5. An injured student who has been transported away from the premises must be accompanied by the instructor, a member of the Event Organizer, and the parents/guardians.

READMISSION TO COMPETITION ACTIVITIES

A student injured in the course of a competition activity will be permitted to participate in the competition only on the written permission of the medical inspector or designated team doctor, designated school health personnel who must first examine the student to determine his/her fitness to participate in competitions. Written notice of that determination, signed by the medical inspector or designated team doctor as appropriate, shall be given to the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s).
